Living in an **Ivory Tower** is a mildly pejorative expression used to describe those who live sheltered lives, away from the harsh realities and problems faced by others. It is of French origin and can be traced back as far as the early 1800s, to a poet named Alfred de Vigney. Alfred led a life of disappointment and in his later years withdrew almost completely from society, while continuing to write. In 1837, in a poem called 'Pensees d'Aout' ('Thoughts of August') written by a critic called Sainte-Beuve, de Vigny's lifestyle is described as isolated, and it was suggested he live in a secluded 'tour d'ivoire' (an 'ivory tower'). The phrase was then widely used to describe other academics who had the reputation of living in a world away from the harsh realities, suggesting they
